



Lifeguard

Job Summary: Individual holding lifeguard certification to perform waterfront duties as scheduled throughout each week of the summer camp season. Position to be paired with another compatible position.

Responsible to: Primary: Waterfront Director; 2nd: Program Director; 3rd: Executive Director

Qualifications:

1. Demonstrate an active and growing personal relationship with Christ.
2. Demonstrate a godly example both on and off of camp grounds.
3. Be in agreement with the sincerely held beliefs, Mission Statement, values and policies of CPBC.
4. Possess a heart for kids of all ages.
5. Demonstrate willingness to serve and strong self-motivation.
6. Possess ability to solve problems and think for one's self.
7. Demonstrate a willingness to learn from "mistakes" and camp situations as they arise.
8. Preferably completed high school, and having one year of college or work experience. Must be at least 16 years old.
9. Able to pass a background check.
10. Hold current certification in CPR, first-aid, and lifeguarding.
11. Possess the ability to swim 300 meters, complete a 15 meter swim dive to the bottom (9ft) and swim to surface while carrying brick up from bottom, complete 2 minutes of treading water without the use of your arms in order to pass the lifeguarding test.

Responsibilities:

1. Attend staff training and staff meetings.
2. Perform lifeguarding duties as instructed by waterfront director when scheduled. These times may include morning Polar Bear swim, afternoon free time, Cabin Bonding time, and other special activities.
3. Assist in organization and management of waterfront and equipment.
4. Respectfully abide by and enforce all camp guidelines, expectations and standards.
5. Participate in programming activities as schedule allows such as chapel skits, music, skills classes, night games, group games and special activities.
6. Lead flag raising devos when scheduled, 2-3 times per summer.
7. Participate in end of the week cleaning.
8. Serve guest groups if and when needed/scheduled.
9. Solve problems as they arise, especially those in need of immediate attention/action.

10. Be available to help in any area needed. These may include but are not limited to kitchen, maintenance, canteen, cabin assistant, program, office, cleaning, and grounds.

This position would also be open to a high school volunteer 16 or older who is willing to spend a significant portion of the summer at camp.

Training and certification are available through camp prior to staff training if needed.

*Responsibilities and schedule may be subject to change in the event of job combinations, as well as summer programming needs.
